

Plastic Surgery

We offer a broad range of cosmetic and reconstructive plastic surgery procedures. From facial rejuvenation and enhancement, both surgical and non-invasive, to fat reduction and body contouring, our specialist consultants can help you achieve your aesthetic goals.



Despite a concerted effort with your exercise regime and a good diet, sometimes excess skin just won't shift. Having a tummy tuck surgery yields fantastic rewards regarding your selfesteem and physical wellbeing. Tummy tuck (also known as abdominoplasty) procedure provide solutions to patients who are looking to rid stubborn fat pockets as a result of pregnancy, weight loss or the natural aging process. This procedure will give you a firmer, flatter abdomen. This procedure is not limited to women, the number of men electing to have a tummy tuck continues to grow.

Breast Augmentation

Many women feel self-conscious about their breast size. Size is dependent on your genetics, but once developed your breasts may fluctuate in response to weight, pregnancy and breastfeeding. Breast enlargement, which involves inserting breast implants behind the breast tissue, either under or over the pectoral muscle, to give a more voluptuous shape, is a safe way to increase confidence and boost self-esteem. Breast enlargement, with it's instantly noticeable results, is a life changing treatment that restores confidence and offers a new lease of life.



Liposuction

People who struggle to lose weight through natural means such as dieting and exercise, particularly in trouble areas including the stomach, underarms, thighs, and hips, may turn to surgical alternatives, including liposuction. The procedure involves removing fat through a medical device called a cannula, which is inserted under the skin at high pressure, and a vacuum is then used to remove fat from the targeted area. This process is typically very fast and produces excellent and immediately noticeable results, leaving a defined shape that enhances body image and confidence.

DIEP Reconstruction

The DIEP flap procedure is a form of breast reconstruction following a mastectomy, using the patient's abdominal fat rather than an implant to create a breast mound. This procedure enables the patient to have a naturally formed breast without the need for any foreign materials and can result in faster recovery with less post operative pain. The procedure is recognised as the 'gold standard' for breast reconstruction after mastectomy. The McIndoe Centre is one of the top three largest independent providers in the UK of this type of surgery, and the largest single site independent provider outside of London.




Blepharoplasty

As we age, gravity pulls down on the soft tissue surrounding our eyes. Once youthful and alert, eyes can become droopy and undefined. Eyelid surgery, also known as blepharoplasty, is a procedure that works to tighten this soft tissue, resulting in bright and open eyes. This procedure can be carried out on the upper or lower eyelids or both.

Facelift

The natural process of aging tends to mean that our jawlines slacken, we lose volume in our soft tissues and bone density, and our eyelids fold and smile lines deepen. Whilst there are a variety of face-lifting techniques available, the most common type of facelift is called a SMAS. During this procedure, your surgeon will make an incision around the ear. From there, the skin can be lifted slightly and tightened. Muscles and tissue can be removed or manipulated to achieve the desired effect. A facelift is the most effective and enduring facial rejuvenation procedure.

Breast reconstruction surgery gets Josephine her confidence again



wo-and-a-half years after being diagnosed with breast cancer, Josephine Mitchell faced surgery for a second time after radiotherapy caused hardening of the original implant breast reconstruction.

Josephine, 59, was referred to Consultant Plastic Surgeon Miss Anita Hazari at The McIndoe Centre where she underwent removal of her right breast prosthesis

and replacement with a DIEP reconstruction, a procedure which involved taking skin and fat from her tummy and creating a breast from it.



Maxillofacial & Oral

We offer a variety of maxillofacial and oral procedures at The McIndoe Centre to treat patients with conditions affecting the mouth, jaw, face and neck. This includes TMJ arthroscopy, tooth extraction, treatment for mouth lesions, dental implants and wisdom tooth removal.



Removal of Impacted Teeth

There are numerous reasons why a patient may consider removing teeth. These include severe pain which can be caused by decay, infection or trauma, gum disease, and overcrowded teeth. One of the most common procedures is wisdom teeth removal. Such cases may require a tooth, or multiple teeth, to be removed in order to reduce pain and discomfort, to avoid the risk of infection spreading and the enablement of other teeth to be repositioned. It was in her early forties that journalist Annika Purdey first noticed her eyelids were beginning to droop, making her look permanently tired.

ecause her role involved a lot of face-to-face contact and being photographed, she contemplated treatment at the time but was held back by a preconception that surgery was 'vain and only for Hollywood actresses'. Four years later, her situation changed:

'I'm naturally confident but was becoming increasingly conscious of my upper lids. When lockdown hit, and I found myself looking at my reflection several hours a day on non-stop Zoom meetings, I knew something had to be done.'

After a couple of consultations with

Mr Nick Parkhouse, Annika decided to have a blepharoplasty procedure, choosing to have it at The McIndoe

Centre as it was close to her home, and she preferred to minimise travel.

On the morning of her procedure Annika checked in at The McIndoe Centre.

Ophthalmology

We offer a variety of procedures to maintain your eye health and optimise your vision. These include the diagnosis and treatment of conditions such as glaucoma and cataracts, that if untreated can result in blindness, as well as laser and surgical treatments for a deteriorated or damaged cornea.



Cataracts

Cataracts is a condition that predominantly affects people over 70, and results from changes in the way the cells of the lens are arranged and their water content, which causes the lens to become cloudy instead of clear. Developing cataracts will cause your sight to become cloudy and misty. The condition, which can affect one or both eyes, is treated by surgery. It is a commonly performed and straightforward procedure that involves removal of the cloudy lens and it's replacement by an artificial lens to help restore your vision.



Glaucoma Treatment

Glaucoma is a condition where the pressure in the eye increases, causing damage to the optic nerve which is critical for sight because it passes signals from the retina to your brain. Without this process we would not be able to see. Glaucoma can lead to a loss of your vision if untreated. The visual loss is usually slow and often has no symptoms. This is why glaucoma is also known as the 'silent thief of sight'. More commonly the peripheral visual field is lost first but glaucoma can affect the central field of vision too. There are various laser treatments available or minimally invasive surgery.

Cornea Treatment


The cornea is the clear window into the eye. When this is scarred or misshapen, treatment is required to remove the scar or to alter the shape of the eye. You can require cornea treatment if damage causes a small hole or infection appears in the cornea, or through degeneration from a condition such as keratoconus – which causes the cornea, to weaken, change shape and become thinner. Most cases of keratoconus can be treated with contact lenses and glasses. However, more severe cases may require a cornea transplant.

fter retiring from a fulfilling career as a chartered surveyor, Bruce Harris* decided to avoid the boredom of retirement and expand his skills to become a driving instructor. It was not until Bruce attended a routine eye test appointment five years later that he discovered his sight was no longer at the required standard and he had to stop the driver training he was enjoying so much. After a lengthy journey through the NHS pathway, Bruce was finally able to receive his treatment at The McIndoe Centre.

Bruce explains: "When I met with my consultant we went through possible causes for the deterioration of my corneas, and it wasn't until then that we worked out it was likely to be the dust from working many summers on hot building sites. He understood the treatment I needed straight away and decided that I required cataract procedures on both eyes, with my left eye being dealt with first. The first procedure then happened the following week.

"I was amazed at the whole process; The McIndoe Centre is just incredible and so modern and clean. From my first appointment for my COVID-19 test to the actual procedure, everything clicked in to place



seamlessly. I felt like the staff who looked after me knew the procedure inside out, they were so informative and reassuring. When it came to the procedure I could not have been cared for better, and although the thought of the surgery can be daunting the first time, I felt no pain at all. It was all over in about 20 minutes, and straight away I was being checked on and offered a hot drink and some delicious food.

"Later that evening at home after I had put my drops in, the difference in my vision became very clear. I was absolutely amazed; I walked over to the bedroom window and for the first time in a very long time, I could see craters on the moon! I also managed to spot the space station, which I could clearly see without any blur. I just could not believe the difference.

"The surgery has meant that I can now reapply to get my driver's licence back, as I can now easily read a registration plate from the specified distance. The change in my vision has also enabled me to carry on with so many projects I couldn't before, in particular the refurbishment of our house. I am looking forward to getting into home repairs again and no longer needing to use a magnifying glass. It has been a brilliant experience all round."

Hand Procedures

We offer a variety of hand procedures, to complement those available at our sister hospital, the Horder Centre. These include treatment to correct carpal tunnel syndrome which affects the wrist, as well as Dupuytren's fasciectomy to relieve the contracture that can limit functionality of the hand.





Carpal Tunnel Release

Carpal Tunnel Syndrome (CTS) is a condition that causes pain and discomfort in the hand and wrist due to increased pressure on the nerve that crosses the front of the wrist. This is called the median nerve and runs through a tight tunnel of tendons, allowing you to bend your fingers. You may require carpal tunnel release if you feel pain and discomfort when moving your fingers and wrist. One of the first signs of CTS is numbness in the thumb, index finger and middle finger – symptoms tend to worsen during the night.

Dupuytren's Fasciectomy

Dupuytren's disease is an inherited condition where scar-like tissue forms just beneath the skin of the fingers and the palm of the hand and causes it to thicken and become hard. Eventually, over time, the fibrous tissue can contract and force one or more fingers to curl up into the palm, making it impossible to straighten the fingers. This is known as Dupuytren's Contracture. When the affected finger can no longer be fully extended as a result of scar tissue which has formed in the palm of the hand, surgery involving removal of any affected skin, will be required to restore proper functionality.

McIndoe Centre helps Diane Meadows get a grip on Dupuytren's Contracture

iane Meadows was first diagnosed with Dupuytren's contracture following a visit to her GP late in 2020. For Diane, who leads an active lifestyle that belies her 87 years, the symptoms weren't painful and initially she carried on without any concerns. However, 12 months later the condition was progressing, it was getting difficult to grip items and beginning to compromise her lifestyle.

In November 2021 she was delighted to be contacted by the McIndoe Centre and consequently came in for corrective surgery by Mr Oliver Harley, one of Horder's Consultant Plastic

Surgeons. The procedure was straightforward and Diane was not required to stay overnight at the Centre. There was only limited discomfort during the procedure or even during recovery. "You are an amazing team and the whole atmosphere in the centre is guaranteed to make patients feel relaxed

and at ease. "



Almost three months on Diane says 'I am delighted I had the surgery and

have no regrets. I have full use of my hand and can cope much better with day-to-day tasks.'

Diane was able to have a minimally invasive treatment for her Dupuytren's disease called 'needle fasciotomy' and I am pleased that she responded very well to this. This technique allows for rapid recovery and minimal rehab. Needle fasciotomy is only suitable for a minority of patients who present with this condition.

New Women's health clinic

he menopause is a natural biological process that affects all women, typically between the ages of 45 and 55, and marks the end of their reproductive years. It can be a challenging time for women with physical and emotional symptoms that can have a significant impact on their overall health.

Recognising that managing menopause symptoms is a vital part of women's healthcare, The McIndoe Centre has established a dedicated Women's Health Clinic, led by menopause specialist Dr Emma Sloan, to offer women fast track access to specialist menopause healthcare.

What happens during the menopause?

During the menopause oestrogen and other hormone levels begin to decline and remain low for good unless replaced. Almost every system in the body is affected by low oestrogen levels, causing changes such as bones getting weaker, the skin stops producing collagen, thinning hair, and the build-up of fat in the midriff. It can also lead to memory loss, hot sweats, mood swings, anxiety and panic attacks, as well as vaginal dryness and reduced libido. Women are also more at risk of recurrent urinary infections, diabetes, stroke and heart disease.

Your treatment options

HRT involves replacing the hormones, including oestrogen and progesterone that the body stops producing. HRT can be administered in various forms, including pills, patches, gels, and creams. There are nonhormonal therapy options that can also be effective in managing menopausal symptoms too. Herbal medicines, therapies such as reflexology, acupuncture, or cognitive behaviour therapy (CBT) are all shown in studies to help manage menopause symptoms.

Other medications that doctors prescribe such as antidepressants or mood stabilisers can be of benefit to women going through menopause as well. However, these medications have potential risks and side effects, and health providers need to evaluate each patient's individual needs before recommending these therapies.

Lifestyle modifications can also play a critical role in managing menopausal symptoms. These can include exercise, stress management techniques, as well as a healthy diet that includes whole grains, fruit and vegetables, and avoids triggers such as alcohol, caffeine and spicy foods.

Acupuncturist Selena Collins pinpoints how HRT works for her



elena Collins, an experienced acupuncturist, had always been adamant she wanted to avoid using HRT due to the negative experience her mother went through on the drug.

Selena explains: "Due to the nature of my work, I was always convinced that I would follow the alternative path when it came to treating menopausal symptoms. In addition to my mother's experience, I had also reacted badly in the past to the Mirena Coil, which cemented my decision.

"I was introduced to Dr Sloan through a friend and attended one of her menopause cafe events. After discussing my fears around HRT and the effects on mental health, she invited me to come and have a consultation with her. I was used to having 10 minutes with my GP to discuss my menopausal symptoms; in this consultation we discussed everything in so much detail including my general health, my symptoms and fears around the medication. She explained it so exceptionally clearly and emphasised how slowly we could start the treatment; I felt safe enough to take a leap of faith to try HRT.

"She rang me once I had started the prescription to check how I was feeling; the whole process was so carefully managed. "The HRT was a game changer. Within two weeks I was sleeping better, I had an improved appetite and mood and I felt like my zest for life came back. There were no side effects - nothing but positive changes. Being an acupuncturist, I was so sceptical at first but because of my experience many of my colleagues and clients have also now self-referred to Dr Sloan.

"As a result of my consultations, I feel like I have an in-depth understanding of everything that is happening to my body. My advice would be to any woman, if you don't feel you fit in the box that your GP is putting you in regarding your menopausal experience, try a consultation with Dr Sloan and make an informed choice."


